## VuInerable Sector Check Policy

The NTCS Board of Directors has recently approved a Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC) policy that can be found here, to take effect September 1, 2023.

It will require that any NTCS parents who intend to volunteer, in any capacity, will be required to provide a Vulnerable Sector Check to NTCS administration prior to their involvement in school activities.

A Vulnerable Sector Check policy is already in place for all NTCS teachers and staff.
The process to obtain a VSC depends on the municipality in which you live. For those who live in Toronto (postal code starting with 'M'), a form signed by the NTCS Principal, Mrs. Brouwer, is required to be submitted as part of the application for a VSC. This can be obtained by emailing her at nbrouwer@ntcs.on.ca.

Other regions (York, Peel, Durham, etc...) have different requirements that can be obtained from their local police department.

Additionally, each staff and volunteer will need to sign an Offence Declaration Form each year that a new VCS is not required. A clear VSC is required every 5 years.

## Tuition Fees 2023-2024

A reminder that tuition fees for the coming 2023/2024 school year are payable starting July $1^{\text {st }}, 2023$. If you are paying tuition through a monthly direct debit/pre-authorized withdrawal, the amount will automatically be updated to the new tuition fee amount. The date ( $1^{\text {st }}$ or $15^{\text {th }}$ ) and frequency will remain the same. If you have replied to our 'Intention to Return' email that your child(ren) does not plan to return in September 2023, or if your child is graduating from Grade 12, your pre-authorized withdrawals will be stopped once your tuition fees for the current school year have been paid in full.

We cannot accept textbooks that will not be used in the new school year or give credit for books that are in disrepair.
