Vulnerable Sector Checks for Winter Chandos

We continue to accept Vulnerable Sector Checks from parents. As we prepare especially for our elementary winter Chandos trips, we are in need of parents who have submitted the documentation so that the students can participate in these highly anticipated excursions to our camp property. Without sufficient supervision for our elementary classes, we will not be able to send the students at certain grade levels. Please consider applying for the VSC as soon as possible as the process can take some time.

Toronto Police Services has their new online portal available for Vulnerable Sector Checks (VSC), and NTCS is registered with the organization code of: 202309TPSON25260. You need this code for both the online portal at www.tps.to/police-checks and for paper applications (which are available from the school office). A VSC is required of all parent volunteers who will be helping out at school. This includes elementary Chandos trips, pizza days, field trip chaperones and those planning to help with Fun Fair in the spring.

Do not submit an online application if you have already mailed in a paper application. This portal is only to be used if your home address postal code begins with an "M". Other regions and municipalities have their own process and application systems.

GUIDANCE NEWS

Ontario University Application Centre/Ontario Colleges Application Services—OUAC/OCAS

All information for our Grade 12 students has been uploaded to OUAC and OCAS. Students in Grade 12 received a tutorial on Thursday, October 26th, leading them through the application setup process online. This means that students are now able to work on selecting and submitting their Ontario university and college applications. Students will need to double-check that the academic information in their account is correct once visible in mid-November. The equal consideration deadline for Ontario university applications is January 15th, 2024, and the college application deadline is February 1st, 2024. It is recommended that applications are submitted prior to Christmas break due to the increasing load on the application system in the new year.

In addition, students are reminded to pay attention to deadlines for scholarships and supplemental applications as these may be different from OUAC and OCAS deadlines, depending on the program and institution. Students applying to colleges and universities outside of Ontario are responsible for informing Mr. Brown of any records that need to be transmitted to the institution from NTCS.

The MCU (Monthly Chapel Update)

Primary Praise and Junior Mini-Chapel:

Students in JK through Grade 6 have been lifting up the name of Jesus through weekly times of worshipping together. **Mrs. Cooke**, **Mr. Garay**, **Mrs. lerullo-Gialone**, **Mrs. Li**, **Mrs. Newsted**, and **Mr. Vant Erve** have all taken turns leading our times of singing. On the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, **Mrs. Cooke** led the JK - Grade 3 crowd in understanding the respect we owe to the Indigenous people of Canada for the enormous length of time they have cared for the land on which we live. **Mrs. Li** and **Mr. teBok-kel's** Grade 6 classes led the Grade 4s and 5s in a very meaningful retelling of the story of *Shi Shi Etko*, a young Indigenous girl who was taken from her family to attend a residential school.

At our Thanksgiving Chapel, **Mrs. Lew-Ong's Gr. 2** class prepared a beautiful choral reading of Psalm 100, and we were visited by some improvisation experts from the high school drama class. We have just recently begun a fun and engaging RightNow Media video series called, "Where Does Joy Come From?", based on the book of Philippians, which should help us to learn some of the ways we can "Be Like Jesus" a little more each day.

Intermediate & Senior Chapel:

Though we did not start chapel times until the Grade 7-12 classes finished their trips to Chandos, we have now had a few very meaningful times of worship and reflection together in the track area. On the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, we were led by the Grade 10B Civics class through a stirring and informative reflection which included a dramatic choral reading.

For our Thanksgiving Chapel, we laughed along with some excellent improvisers and were moved nearly to tears by some touching moments, all presented by members of the high school drama classes. **Mr. Vant Erve** led an introduction to the year's theme, "Be Like Jesus", which centres around Philippians 2:1-5, Ephesians 4:4-16, and the lyrics to the hymn, "May the Mind of Christ, My Saviour", which he hopes the whole student body will have memorized by the end of the year! Most recently, we were joined by **Phil Pharoah**, Youth Pastor at Uxbridge Baptist Church, who encouraged us to be a friend like Jesus was to Mary and Martha.

We have been led in worship by **Mr. Lau's** student worship bands, which have already been practicing twice a week and continue to involve a large percentage of the student body using and developing their talents to serve the Lord and the NTCS community.

NTCS Aquatics

Lessons began the week of October 15th, and we were happy to welcome swimmers, both old and new, into our pool. We have had a great turnout these past two weeks and look forward to teaching everyone in the remaining six weeks. Classes are currently scheduled to end the week of December 3rd. If families were not able to register for our fall program, we plan to run a winter session in the New Year. It is tentatively scheduled to begin the week of January 7th.

The deadline to register for Bronze Medallion or Bronze Cross is **Monday, November 13**th. A minimum of six candidates in each class is required to run either course.

Biology Class Visits the ROM

The Grade 11 biology class had a meaningful learning opportunity at the Royal Ontario Museum (ROM) on October 27th. Given the vast collections at the ROM, the students were able to explore the diversity of living things from the different kingdoms of life. The students also investigated the consequences of human impact and climate change on biodiversity through a self-guided tour while completing an interactive scavenger hunt. It was certainly an enjoyable and organic learning experience for the class.

Art Gallery of Ontario Visit

The Grade 9 to 12 art students recently had the opportunity to visit the Art Gallery of Ontario, in downtown Toronto. The students attended a guided tour entitled, *Art, Identity and Intersectionality*" where they explored "personal and cultural expressions of identity through art, while also examining the social and cultural influences that shape both individual and collective identities." The students also enjoyed seeing the KAWS:Family exhibit which included sculptures of cartoon-inspired characters that were "larger than life", as well as many other wall murals, sketches, and paintings by the artist.

For their next project, the students in Grades 9 and 10 will seek to apply what they observed to their work as they design their own 3D sculpture, inspired by KAWS, and construct it using plaster rolls and paint. Grade 11 and 12 students will be using mixed media to apply lines and bright, vivid colours, as in the style of KAWS, to their portrait of an individual expressing a single emotion.

It will be exciting to see how the students incorporate the elements which they observed into their own artwork.

Trip to the Kortright Centre for Conservation—Grade 4

The Grade 4 students participated in a field trip to the Kortright Centre for Conservation on October 25th. This trip was an extension of our science strand, *Habitats & Communities*. During our hike, we identified several producers, consumers, and decomposers and explored their adaptations and life cycles. We found a herd of sheep, several frogs, salamanders, a millipede, and some other decomposers, as well as a huge mushroom.

The students enjoyed several games along the way that included a favourite, "Camouflage." Students enjoyed playing the roles of foxes, bunnies, owls, and rodents as they learned about prey and predators. As geese, they learned about the effects of habitat loss and destruction due to manmade construction, paving of roads, deforestation, and pollution. Finally, we learned about the habitats of several birds of prey and were delighted to see a *Burrowing Owl*, a *Great Horned Owl*, a *Bald Eagle*, a *Peregrine Falcon*, and a *Ferruginous Hawk*. We also dissected real owl pellets!

The class discovered the importance of following God's biblical mandate to rule the earth and care for all creatures, mankind, and habitats responsibly. This understanding will be important during our spring novel study of *Owls in the Family*, by Farley Mowat.

Lost and Found

Please ensure that you **LABEL** your child's gym uniform items, school uniform items, jackets and outdoor clothing, footwear, water bottles, lunch pails, backpacks and school textbooks. Items are picked up daily and put in lost and found areas. You can avoid having to replace these items by making sure your child's name or initials and grade are on them. We will return any lost items that can be identified to your child.

Colder Weather

Parents, please help ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the colder weather that is starting to come upon us. We will be continuing with outside activities, even during cold conditions, to enable students to enjoy their recess breaks.
