## ***Tuition Rates 2024-2025***

The following are the tuition rates for the academic school year 2024/2025 set at the recent Board of Directors meeting.

One child:	\$12672 or \$1056/month (an increase of \$720/year or \$60/month)
Two children:	\$20280 or \$1690/month (an increase of \$1152/year or \$96/month)
Three children:	\$25344 or \$2112/month (an increase of \$1440/year or \$120/month)
Four children:	\$26352 or \$2196/month (an increase of \$1440/year or \$120/month)
International student rate:	\$19190 (an increase of \$1090)

These changes represent a general increase of 6.0%.

We have already been connecting with individuals and families who are looking for a Christian education for their children, some who have heard of us through your personal networks. Please feel free to continue to direct those you know to our school website, or they can contact the school office by phone or email. Please note that a student must take a minimum of seven courses in Grade 11 and six courses in Grade 12 to continue their studies at NTCS.

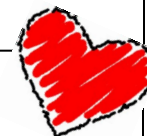
Keep checking your OUAC, OCAS and specific university or college student accounts to stay informed about any outstanding requirements or notices of acceptance.

## Exam Schedule (Grades 7-12)

Since the writing of exams is in itself a valuable skill to be mastered, particularly for the university bound student, the policy of NTCS is that there are no exemptions from final exams for any student. The exam schedule has been recently posted in the "Daily Announcements" Google Classroom.

Students are expected to arrange their end-of-year schedules accordingly so that they are physically present to write their final exams at the designated times.

## *Winter Weather Policy*

The winter months are still with us, as is the potential for more snow and extreme cold, slippery roads, and greater traffic congestion.

Very wintry days often result in many students arriving late. Please remember to take the weather into consideration when dropping off your child(ren) in the morning and/or picking them up in the evening. Leaving earlier from home in the morning or from work, if possible, in the evening is helpful to avoid unnecessary traffic problems and to avoid late pick-up charges if your child(ren) are in extended care. Also, it is essential to have a back-up plan in place in the event that it is impossible for you to pick up your child(ren) on any given day due to major winter delays.



Our school policy is to remain open on all school days no matter what the weather (unless, of course, the whole city is closed down). However, you must decide for your own family whether it is safe and whether it makes sense to send or take your child(ren) to school on any specific day. On **very bad weather days**, when many schools within the city limits are closed, students will not be penalized for an absence.

## *Elementary Cold Weather Policy*

Our primary concern is always for the safety of our students. We will only take the children outside when it is safe to do so. The guidelines established are that when the combined temperature and wind chill are **-28C** or lower, the students will remain indoors due to the risk of frostbite. When temperatures with the wind chill factor are between **-20C and -28C**, we will shorten recesses to approximately 10 minutes depending on the local conditions, such as if it is sunny, windy, or currently snowing. The teachers on yard duty have also been instructed to use their discretion and to shorten recess to ensure student safety and welfare when necessary. At temperatures above **-20C**, students will go out for regular recess.

It is important that parents send their child(ren) with clothing that allows them to participate in outdoor activities every day during the winter months. Please note that students will be playing outside during extended care and before and after school, so it is essential that extra clothing be packed, especially items like mitts, socks, and pants. On extremely cold days, students in extended care will wait in the track area until they are picked up from the NORTH doors.

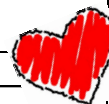
If you feel your child is not well enough to participate in recess due to recent illness or not feeling well, then it would be wise to keep them at home until they are able to participate fully in all aspects of the school program. Proper supervision of the children becomes difficult when students are not able to go outside.

This does not include bicycle or ski helmets. Students who are not skating should remain at home as we cannot supervise them at the rink.**

## SKI DAY—Grades 4-12!

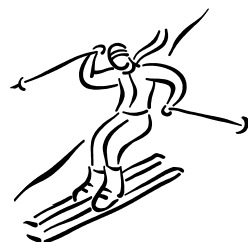
Our annual ski trip to Mount St. Louis/Moonstone is happening this month! We are excited to offer Grade 4 to 12 students an opportunity to spend the day on the slopes with their friends on **February 27<sup>th</sup>**.

Once you have completed the online registration, please send an e-transfer payment to [admin@ntcs.on.ca](mailto:admin@ntcs.on.ca). In the message box, please include your child(ren)'s name(s) and indicate that the payment is for the ski trip.

The fee for this trip is as follows:

1. **\$71** - Includes lift ticket, lesson, and transportation
2. **\$91** - Includes lift ticket, lesson, ski rentals, and transportation
3. **\$54** - Ski pass holder and transportation



If renting equipment, students **must be renting skis**. For safety reasons, we do not allow students to rent snowboarding equipment for this trip.

All students will be required to do a ski-off, and the instructors will put each student into a lesson, based on their demonstrated skill level. The ski-off ensures a fun and safe time for all participants on the trip.

For students who do not register for the ski trip, it will be a **regular school day**. Spaces will be reserved on a first-come, first-served basis until the buses are full. In order to successfully reserve your spot, **registration and payment** must be completed.

The deadline to register is **Thursday, February 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024**.



## Mathematics Contests

The integer 203 has an odd ones digit, an even tens digit, and an even hundreds digit. How many integers between 100 and 999 have an odd ones digit, an even tens digit, and an even hundreds digit?

In November 2023, 34 of our students in Grades 9 to 12 participated in the Canadian Intermediate and Senior Mathematics Contests sponsored by the University of Waterloo. After quickly seeing that the answer to the above question is 100, students completed six progressively more challenging questions. 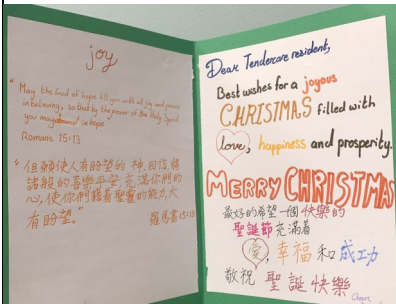
## Service Project - Grade 2

## ***Camp Ke-Mon-Oya Registration Has Begun!***

### ***ONLINE REGISTRATION IS AVAILABLE AT CAMP KEMONOYA.COM***

Once again, our camp program will operate this upcoming summer. If your child attended last summer, you will already have received a brochure by email, along with an income tax receipt. Brochures and application forms are now available online for those students who are interested in attending. As registrations are received on a first-come, first-served basis, it is important that you submit your application early for the week(s) you want in order to avoid the disappointment of them being full later.

The first 2 weeks are Junior camp, starting Monday, July 8<sup>th</sup>, for students entering Grades 3-6 in September. The last 3 weeks are Teen weeks, starting Monday, July 22<sup>nd</sup>, for students going into Grades 7-10.

In the past, some of our students have participated in camp life as a Leader-in-Training (LIT) or camp counsellor. The LIT program runs during the first 3 weeks of July. Students must be entering Grade 11 in September 2024 to be eligible. This program includes Bible study, leadership seminars, activity training and helping out around the camp wherever needed. For the final week, LITs assist a senior counsellor in a cabin as a junior counsellor and help with camp activities.

There are also some openings for senior counsellors. Students must be at least 15 years of age to work at Junior Camp and at least 17 years old to work at Teen Camp. Students must complete an application form and be interviewed in order to be considered for the LIT program or for a counsellor position.

Applications for both LIT and senior counsellor positions are available on the camp website ([campkemonoya.com](http://campkemonoya.com)) and are to be sent to [gbrinkman@ntcs.on.ca](mailto:gbrinkman@ntcs.on.ca) for consideration. The deadline for LIT and camp counsellor applications is Thursday, February 29<sup>th</sup>.
