- May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024 is the deadline for Grade 12 students to submit outside course report cards and community service hour documentation. The requirement for community service this year is 40 hours. Failure to submit documents by May 31<sup>st</sup> could result in not being able to participate in the graduation ceremony in June.

# The NTCS MCU (Monthly Chapel Update for Jan-Feb 2024)

#### **Primary Praise & Mini-Chapel:**

Students from JK to grade 6 have been working through a RightNow Media video series by **Phil Vischer** (creator of Veggie Tales) entitled, "Where Does Joy Come From?". It's a study of the whole book of Philippians and is a remarkable mix of comedy and deep truths - all helping us to "Be Like Jesus". Each of our elementary teachers have taken their turn in leading times of worship, along with contributions from Mrs. lerullo-Gialone, Mr. Vant Erve and Mrs. Newsted. An initiative we started this year is giving each class an opportunity to present their Bible memory work at these chapel times. It's been a great way to motivate our students to "hide God's Word in their heart"!

#### **Intermediate & Senior Chapel:**

So far in the new year, our high school chapel times have focussed on mental health and how we can "Be Like Jesus" and overcome adversity by adopting the Mind of Christ. To begin with, we studied a RightNow Media video series on the book of Philippians by Jennie Allen entitled, "Get Out of Your Head". This was also the focus of our recent Spiritual Emphasis Day, where students participated in times of teambuilding led by SaLT, mental health workshops led by professional counsellors, and sessions of teaching and reflection led by Phil Pharoah (Knowing Me Like Jesus), James Bi (Knowing God's Will), and our keynote speaker this year, Michael Da Silva (Embracing the Lord's Prayer). Most recently we were visited by Alyssa Esparaz of Compassion Canada, who highlighted for us that cultivating the Fruit of the Spirit in our lives is another way that we can "think and act like Christ Jesus". Thanks, as always, go out to Mr. Lau and all the members of our worship teams for their skilful leadership in musical worship throughout these chapel times.
